Rocco Benvenuti and Drew Weidenbach shared the shutout.

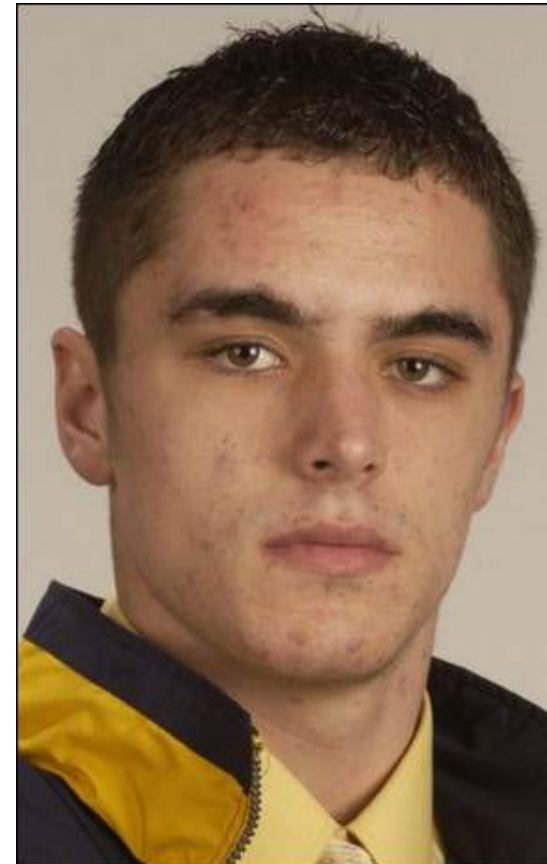
Josh Foster, Mark Morley, Corey Weaver and Hunter had the goals for the Saints, who play host to Chippewa Valley on Thursday.

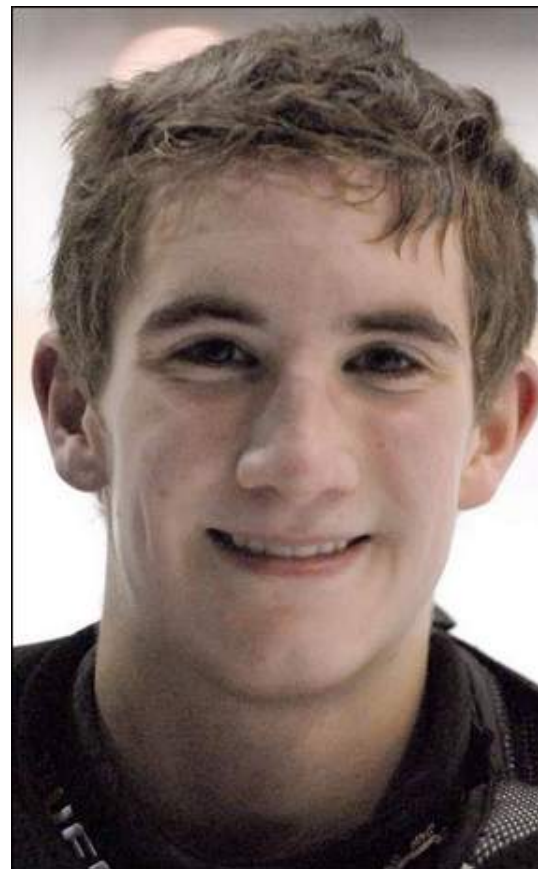
Ryan Axsom scored the game-winner 2:45 into overtime for the Huskies at McMorran Pavillion.
