



# Pilots unravel

■ Finney defeats DLS in double OT.

**GROSSE POINTE FARMS** — De La Salle's basketball season ended with a double-heart-breaker.

Angelo Mason made a layup with 9.5 seconds remaining, and De La Salle turned the ball over twice in the final 21 seconds to derail its postseason hopes in a 69-67 double-overtime loss to Detroit Finney in a Class A regional final at Grosse Pointe South on Wednesday.

De La Salle led by as many as seven points in the second half, led by six early in the fourth quarter and led in each of the overtime periods. But the Pilots could not hold off a senior-dominated Detroit Finney squad.

Mason, a senior center, finished with 17 points, and senior guard Kavon Rose scored 16 points, including critical 3-pointers in each of the overtime periods for the Highlanders (21-4 overall).

"They had great senior leadership," said De La Salle coach Greg Esler, whose team finished with a 16-8 overall record. "They made their free throws. They made their shots down the stretch."

The Pilots also made some critical plays.

Kevin McCarthy split a pair of free throws with 10.9 seconds left in the fourth quarter to force the first overtime, and Alex Marcotullio made three free throws with 6.5 seconds remaining in the first extra period to force double OT.

But De La Salle faltered down the stretch, turning the ball over with 21 seconds left and the scored tied at 67-67. Then, following Mason's layup that gave Finney the lead, the Pilots turned the ball over again with 1.5 seconds remaining to allow the Highlanders to seal the victory.

"We had the play we wanted," Esler said. "They just rushed it a bit. ... But our kids kept battling."

De La Salle led 32-29 after a back-and-forth first half that featured 15 lead changes and six ties.

The Pilots maintained their lead throughout the third quarter, and they took a 48-42 lead on a 3-pointer by Alex Harville with 6:30 remaining in the fourth. But Finney responded with a

# No repeat for Parkway Christian

■ Eagles fall to Detroit City in regional finals.

**BIRMINGHAM** — It looked like Parkway Christian would surrender its Class D boys' basketball regional title without putting up a fight. Barely two minutes into Wednesday night's regional final at Roper Community Center, the Eagles trailed Detroit City, 10-2.

Head coach Jim Barker called a timeout and challenged his team in the huddle. His players, particularly seniors Larry Houser and Pat Lubeck, heeded the call.

"The kids battled," Barker said. "I'm

very proud of these kids. (They had) 24 and 18 (win seasons) in two years and won a lot of championships."

But not on Wednesday night, as Parkway Christian fell short of a second consecutive regional crown in a 58-48 defeat to the Bears.

The Eagles erased their early deficit with back-to-back 3-pointers by Lubeck. They were his only points of the game, but they drastically changed the game's mood. Lubeck kept the Eagles settled throughout, committing only one turnover.

"The game early on, I think we came out scared," said Houser, who scored a

team-high 16 points. "Our coach motivated us to go out and do what we practice. We came out (of the timeout) and hit some shots and Pat got the ball to people and we did good."

The Eagles ended the first quarter trailing only 12-11 after Lubeck found Zurlon Tipton for a layup. Tipton, Parkway's leading scorer this season, did not have another field goal in the first half. He and fellow junior Matt Cooper finished with 13 points apiece, but they combined for only nine in the first half.

"We missed some easy shots. Coop and Zurlon were not into it early," Barker said. "They're our keys inside, that was our goal."

A lot of their troubles had to do with

# Celtics run away

■ Garnett drops in 31 as Boston wins season series.

**BOSTON** — We've seen this game before, usually in late May. The Pistons' passing attack stalls, they resort to one-on-one

play and then misfire one contested jumper after another. The opponent relies on a superstar for easy points, grabs an early lead

and then withstands a futile Pistons rally.

It happened against Dwyane Wade and Miami in the conference finals two seasons ago. It happened against LeBron James and Cleveland last spring. And it happened once again in the rubber match of the Pistons' regular-season series against Kevin Garnett and Boston.

This game could very well be a precursor to this year's conference finals. The Pistons trailed by 14 in the early going, rallied late in the third quarter, then got outscored 12-1 in the final 5:11 of a 90-78 Celtics victory Wednesday night.

Garnett had 31 points and Paul Pierce heated up in the late going while the Pistons shot just 36 percent. Boston extended its conference lead to four games and

**DETROIT** — The St. Louis Blues brought the Detroit Red Wings down to their knees, Wednesday night, at Joe Louis Arena.

Unfortunately for the Blues, from their knees is where the Red Wings scored a pair of goals on their way to a 4-1 victory.

Johan Franzen scored the winning goal, breaking a 1-1 tie halfway through the second period, after being knocked down from behind by defenseman Eric Brewer. Franzen nevertheless was able to tuck the rebound of a Mikael Samuelsson shot past goalie Manny Legace

for his 14th goal of the season. "Those are the kind of goals you've got to score at playoff time," said Detroit coach Mike Babcock.

The goal was Franzen's second in as many games. "The puck was bouncing our way this time; it's been a while," said Franzen. "I'm not used to scoring streaks. I hope I can get going."

The Red Wings took a two-goal lead 6:11 into the third period when Brian Rafalski scored in his first game back after missing three weeks with a strained groin.

Rafalski carried the puck into the St. Louis zone from center ice. As he was knocked to the ice by a defender, Rafalski let loose a wrist shot that used St. Louis defenseman Matt Walker as a screen.

Legace didn't see the puck as it went by him for Rafalski's career-high 11th goal of the season.

"I didn't really see it," said Rafalski. "I got knocked over. He didn't move and I didn't move. I was like, 'Where's the puck?'"

Pavel Datsyuk added an insurance marker with 1:31 left in the game, stripping St. Louis de-

fenseman Barret Jackman of the puck from behind in the neutral zone, turning and putting it into an empty net.

The goal was Datsyuk's 25th of the season and his second of the night.

The Russian center opened the scoring 5:28 into play, putting the rebound of a Tomas Kopecky shot in off the stick of Brad Boyes.

It was Datsyuk's third multi-goal game of the season and his first since Dec. 4. The Blues tied the score at 1-1 with 1:33 left in

# Dakota bows out

■ GPN blasts past Cougars 5-0 in D-1 quarterfinal.

**ST. CLAIR SHORES** — There was certainly no shortage of senior talent on the ice for Dakota Wednesday night.

But even with all that experience, Dakota found itself shaking off early jitters while

playing in its first-ever state quarterfinal. Grosse Pointe

North took advantage of the Cougars' lack of experience, pouncing early for a pair of first-period goals during a 5-0 win at St. Clair Shores' Civic Arena.

"They play in a better league than we play in and it's a lot more competitive," Dakota coach Dave Koons said.

"We're not used to games like this. That was obvious."

North, twice a state champion and once a runnerup, used its big-game experience to its advantage. The Norsemen came out firing, outshooting the Cougars 17-4 in the first period.

Junior forward Jimmy Tocco made Dakota pay on the game's fourth shot on goal. Senior forward Kevin Gibson skated behind the goal and found Tocco out front. Tocco settled the puck and fired a wrist shot past Cougar goalie Paul Savage for a 1-0 lead just 1:46 into the game.

Continuing to pressure Dakota with its forechecking, the Norsemen struck again with 5:44 left in the period as senior forward Tim Tibaudo beat Savage on a rebound for a 2-0 advantage.

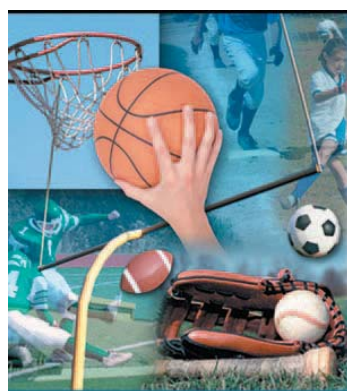
"We wanted to get the first goal to give us some momentum," North coach Scott Lock said. "We didn't want to give them any life whatsoever. We came out in the first period and we took care of business when we needed to. I told the kids 'you're going to win this game in the first period. It's a three-period game but you're going to come out and dictate

# 'I want to take back my sport'

■ Correll has a message for 285-pound defending state champ.

**SHELBY TOWNSHIP** — Eisenhower's Brett Correll has a message for Detroit Catholic Central's Mike Martin, the Division 1 285-pound defending state champ, "I want to take back my sport."

And that's what has all eyes focused on a possible semifinal match Friday night at The Palace of Auburn Hills, where the two could meet to decide who will wrestle Saturday for the 285-pound state title.

"I want to tell that football player to get out of here and go back and put on his shoulder pads and say hut, hut, hike, whatever," Correll said. "For him to come into my sport and take that, it's just annoying because these guys (in the sport) have worked at it forever. And here he comes in his first time and just because he's a big athlete."

Correll has been wrestling for over 10 years, coming up through the ranks of the Eagle Wrestling Club and All Sport Wrestling Club, where former teammate and two-time state champ Chad Vallone came out of.

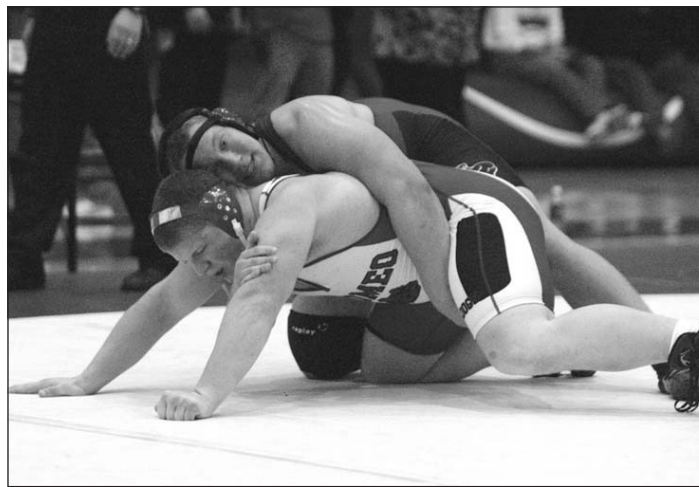
This is Martin's second year of wrestling. "I respect him as an athlete and he might be a good person, but as for a wrestler I don't like him in my sport," Correll said. "What I saw at the state meet (last year) was strength and (athletic ability), I didn't see any wrestling ability, or anything worth while."

Which is kind of a funny thing, since it's athletic ability that has helped Correll get through the season with just one loss. "He still wrestles like a 215-pounder," Eisenhower coach Dave Drath said. "He's very athletic. Guys at 285 are not used to that. Heavyweights are used to pushing and pulling."

Correll has placed third at 215 pounds at the state meet each of the last two years. "I want to tell that football player to get out of here and go back and put on his shoulder pads and say hut, hut, hike, whatever," Correll said. "For him to come into my sport and take that, it's just annoying because these guys (in the sport) have worked at it forever. And here he comes in his first time and just because he's a big athlete."

"(Bumping up to 285) has kind of been like I thought it would be," Correll said. "I've kept my speed up and they're not able to handle it. "You get around the big hips and the big shoulders and you're good," said Correll, whose only loss this year was to Oak Park's Marcel Dubose. "They don't move that fast around to keep up with you."

Martin, who also has just one loss on the year, also uses his ath-

letic ability at that weight to get by.

"We don't talk about a possible meeting with Martin," Drath said. "We try not to focus on that. When you start focusing on others you lose what your strengths are. We're just focusing on what he needs to do to win. There are no slouches at this level."

Martin's only chink in his armor came in a regional final against Hartland's D.J. Charneski. One week after beating Charneski in a district final, 6-3, Martin got pinned with nine seconds left in the match. At the time, Martin was in complete control of the match.

That loss put Martin on the same side of the 285-pound bracket with Correll and thus they would meet in a semifinal instead of the championship match.

Correll and Martin are the only two wrestlers at 285 with just one loss.

Correll, who beat Romeo's Andrew Stebbins in both a district and regional final, faces Holland's Zach Payton (39-10) in the first round, while Martin takes on Temperance Bedford's Mason Cole (41-17) during his opening match.

"I always seem to be feeling good at this time of the year, but you get to this level and you're wrestling the best in the state," Correll said. "And sometimes things don't go your way."

"All I know is that three days of the weekend you have to be wrestling your best," Correll added. "And I'm looking forward to bringing it to anybody."

## Will this be his year?

Each of the last two years, Warren Woods-Tower's Brennan Brumley has lost in the championship match and both times to Plainwell's Jeffrey Steele and both times in extra time. Last year he dropped a 4-2 decision in overtime and then lost on criteria in 2006 after both wrestlers failed to score a point.

This year, Brumley's path to a Division 2 state title at 140 isn't an easy one. If he gets by Petoskey's Wes Hoover in the first round, he could face Mattawan's Nick Bra-

how this game is going to be played.

That was pretty much the order of business all game long. North, which outshot Dakota 42-12 for the game, made it 3-0 early in the second period on a goal by Gibson. The forward followed up a miss by teammate Michael Colosimo, beating a sprawling Savage to give his team a three-goal cushion.

The Norsemen added a pair of goals in the third period. Junior John Neveux and Gibson scored 40 seconds apart to put the game away.

"I think in the third period I think we were a little deeper. They might have run out of gas," said Lock, whose team improves to 16-10-2 and will now face Marquette in the Division 1 semifinals Friday at Compuware Arena in Plymouth.

Marquette blasted North 8-2 in last year's semifinal round.

Wednesday night's game might have been uglier had it not been for Savage, who allowed four goals while stopping 32 shots.

"I thought he played fantastic," Lock said. "In the first period he made some unbelievable saves to keep them in the game, stuff that I would say 'this is a goal,' and then he would pull it out of somewhere. He made some fantastic saves."

"If it wasn't for him it would have been over early and we wouldn't have even played the third period," Koons said of his senior goalie.

Dakota did have its chances in the first two periods. The Cougars pressured during a power play midway through the first period,

zeau in a quarterfinal. Brazeau has one loss. If Brumley, who's the lone undefeated wrestler at the weight, gets through his first three matches, he should run into Mason's Garrett Rozeboom. Rozeboom has one loss this year and won the 130-pound title a year ago.

## Four-time state placer?

Lakeview's Steve Light is looking to join a select group of Macomb County wrestlers by placing at the state meet for a fourth straight year. Light, who faces Mount Morris' Ryan Ellison in his opening match in Division 2 at 125, placed third last year. As a sophomore he came in eighth a year after placing fourth as a freshman.

Other wrestlers looking to improve on their placing from a year ago are Anchor Bay's Robbie Bidlingmaier (fifth at 112), L'Anse Creuse's Cameron Amateis (seventh at 119), Romeo's Nick Bara (eighth at 125), Roseville's Robert Nash (eighth at 135) and Lakeview's Steve Conway (eighth at 160).

New Haven's Ryan Matthews is also looking to become a two-time state placer. In 2006, as a freshman, Matthews placed eighth at 103.

## State champs

Since 1990, the county has crowned at least one state champ. Last year, Chippewa Valley's Joe Fisher was the lone wrestler to walk away from The Palace of Auburn Hills with an individual title.

The most county champs crowned during one year has been five and that's happened twice — 2006 (Chad Vallone, Eisenhower, 125; Kevin Julien, Fraser, 135; Anthony Biondo, Chippewa Valley, 145; Will Rewitzer, Lincoln, 171; Chad Bleske, Romeo, 215 and 1997 (John Burke, Anchor Bay, 125; Brian Norton, Romeo, 130; Kyle Williamson, Roseville, 189; Jon West, Lincoln, 171; Brian Schwartz, Richmond, 215.

with junior forward Kyler Kolb sending a wrister into the glove of GPN goalie Eric Rohrkemper.

In all, Rohrkemper made 12 saves to pick up the shutout. He's allowed just two goals in the Norsemen's four playoff games.

"This is the furthest we've ever gone," Koons said. "We haven't played in many games like this. I thought we were tight the whole game. We didn't have that jump we had early on.
