Turco stymies Wings

Former U-M star stops 37 shots to beat Detroit 3-1

DALLAS (AP) — Marty Turco made 37 saves, rookies Tom Wandell and Fabian Brunnstrom scored goals and the Dallas Stars beat the Detroit Red Wings 3-1 on Friday night in their first meeting since last season's Western Conference finals. Turco, the former University of Michigan star who came into the game with a 3.41 goals-against average, made 29 saves in the final two periods. Brett Lebeda's goal in the first

period gave Detroit a 1-0 lead. Wandell, who had his first NHL goal in his second career game, and Brunnstrom scored in a 1:40 span in the second period to give the Stars the lead. Mike Ribeiro added an empty-net goal. Ty Conklin, making his third straight start for Detroit, stopped 21 shots. The Red Wings beat the Stars in six games last season in the conference final en route to their 11th Stanley Cup title. Because of injuries to veterans Brenden Morrow, Sergei Zubov and Jere Lehtinen, Dallas had a

Phoenix, scored at 5:47 of the second to tie it at 1. Off a Red Wings' turnover in their own zone, the 21-year-old rookie put a shot past Conklin from the slot. Dallas took the lead when

Brunnstrom scored from the high slot at 7:27. Turco, who came into the game with a 2-10-5 mark against Detroit, made sure the lead help up. He stopped 14 shots in the third, including a glove save on Henrik Zetterberg with less than 7 minutes left. Dallas had only three shots in the third period. The Stars, who have the fewest points in the West, won for the fourth time in six games. Lebeda took a pass from Jiri Hudler and beat Turco from the right circle at 6:05 of the first to put the Red Wings ahead 1-0.

Redding placed on IR

ALLEN PARK — Two summers ago, the Lions lavished Cory Redding with a seven-year, \$49-million contract — the largest ever for a defensive lineman.

Their payoff so far? Twenty-nine games, four sacks and one season-ending trip to injured reserve.

The Lions placed Redding on IR Friday with a knee injury he suffered nearly two months ago in a game at Houston. Shaun Cody will start at under tackle Sunday against Indianapolis, and the Lions (0-13) re-signed defensive tackle Langston Moore to take Redding's place.

Defensive coordinator Joe Barry said Redding will require some sort of surgery. "It's a big loss for us," Barry said. "Cory brought a lot to the table as a player, as a leader. His name's up on that (captain's) banner twice, so when you lose that it does have an effect. But it gives a chance for another guy to step up and make plays." Redding, who has three sacks this season but none in the last five games, told his linemates over dinner Thursday at the Capital Grille that his season was over. Rookie defensive tackle Landon Cohen said Redding was concerned "about possibly never

Maroki leads strong first-quarter effort for Stallions

Junior Mason Maroki and the Sterling Heights Stallions dominated the first quarter and jumped out to an early lead en route to a 71-38 victory over Warren Woods-Tower in a MAC crossover boys basketball game Friday night.

Maroki scored all nine of his points in the first quarter to give Sterling Heights a 14-point lead and the Stallions never looked back in improving 2-0 overall.

Junior forward Pat Finegan led the Stallions with 11 points

and 10 of his teammates also scored. Finegan was followed closely by Albert Nuculli and Frank Sanders, who scored 10 points apiece.

“Our defense is just getting better and better,” Sterling Heights coach Mike Griffin said. “We have a young team, and we’re just focusing on constant improvement, and it’s starting to show. But, it’s early and we’re going to keep on, keeping on. Defense is the one thing we stress constantly and it has been paying off.”

Even after building a comfortable lead throughout the first three quarters, the Sterling Heights offense did not slack off. Four different players sunk 3-point baskets as the team put a total of 17 points on the scoreboard in the fourth quarter. Seven different players made at least one 3-pointer.

“We’ve been working on them (3-pointers),” Griffin said.

“We’re trying to space the court out this year and shoot the three-point shot a lot more...use that as a weapon.”

Senior Andrew Rumpz and sophomore guard Jacob Warwinsky led the Titans with 10 points apiece.

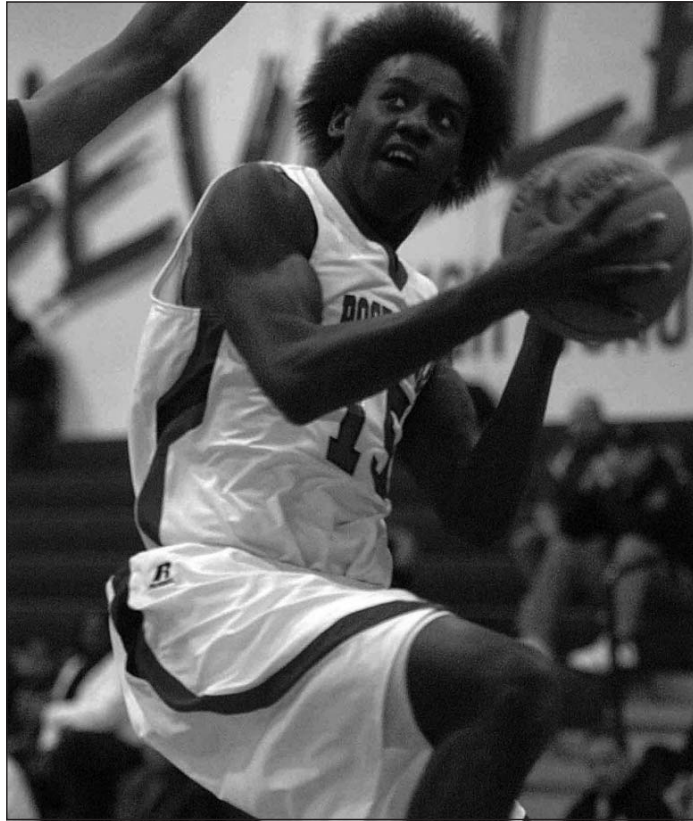
