

# After rocky start, Dakota is back

Every preseason, when The Macomb Daily gears up for another high school hockey preview edition, there is a goal that nearly every coach has in mind: starting the year off on the right skate.

All teams hope to build momentum off of early season success, then ride the wave as far as possible, before peaking around the time that the state playoffs arrive.

But, what happens when it doesn't go to plan? What do you do when you stumble — instead of charge — out of the gates?

Quite simply, the good teams pull together and turn it around, while weaker teams let it ruin their season. You can count Dakota as one of the good teams. However, the Cougars may not have realized it at first.

The Cougars climbed to the top in 2007, becoming the first school not in Saint Clair Shores to win an outright Macomb Area Conference Red Division title. Naturally, expectations for the program remained high as the 08-09 campaign got under way.

Perception and reality had a violent collision. Dakota dropped three consecutive games to open the year. It was the Cougars' first three-game losing streak since the '05-'06 season. Inevitable tension ensued. A couple players even left the team. But what they and several other skaters probably failed to realize was the intent of head coach Dave Koons.

Instead of front-loading his schedule with cream-puff teams that would allow for easy wins and Playstation-type stats, Koons decided to go another route. He lined up games with South Lyon, Novi and Southgate Anderson — each a perennially strong program.

"We started out playing some really difficult teams," Koons explained. "We didn't fare well, record-wise, but we got that experience. Our early schedule has really helped us out, because now we're coming together more as a team."

That much has been clear. In its last four games, all against MAC Red opponents, Dakota went 3-0-1. They have not lost to a team in the division all season, and have a four-point lead over Utica, whom they defeated last Friday. Another positive: the win over the Chieftains put Dakota above the .500 mark at 9-8-1 overall.

As far as the team's biggest strength is concerned, Koons believes it is between the pipes. A

football-related injury to junior keeper Trevor Miller put the Cougars in a precarious situation in the preseason. The coaching staff was worried that the starting reins would be handed to a freshman goalie. They got a pleasant surprise when seniors Spencer Gold and Peter Tropper joined the team.

"Our goaltending has been outstanding this season," Koons said. "They are both big guys who move really well. Spencer is really athletic and Peter is a real solid guy that takes up a lot of the net. They've both done an excellent job for us."

Team captains Steve Seaman, Kyler Kolb and Matt Demers have provided a lot of stability up front. Seaman leads the team with 10 goals on the season. All three are point-per-game players. In a testament to the well-balanced Dakota offense, junior forwards Alex Johansons and Jeff Monfils actually lead the team in points, with 20 and 19, respectively.

If there is an area of the team that Koons would like to see improve, it is the defense.

"Our defense is playing a lot better than we expected," Koons said. "But, our team defense still needs work. We like to play a pretty wide-open style that lets the kids be creative. It's fun to score goals, but we just need to continue to improve that team defense."

As the team draws closer and closer to securing its second consecutive Red title, focus naturally will shift to the playoffs. The Cougars made an outstanding run last season, dispatching Eisenhower, Utica and Troy Athens en route to the school's first regional championship win. While post-season success is a part of the Dakota's recent history, Koons is very quick to point out that this season's group is quite different than that of a year ago.

"We graduated 12 players from last year and added guys from nine different teams," Koons explained. "With the way we coach, you have to be disciplined and the kids are finally buying

into the idea. I said from the first day I got here that we eventually want to be up there with the top teams and contend for a state title. I'm not going to say that this team can't do it, but I will say that we're not afraid to play anybody."

It's an attitude that should serve Koons and his young team well in the years to come. Perhaps the rest of the teams throughout the MAC will follow suit and try to schedule games against top competitors as well — opting to take their lumps early and turn them into learning experiences.

For several of the top MAC teams, February will be the proving ground that determines whether a long playoff run or an early exit awaits. Koons is pleased with the direction of the team and feels that a strong work ethic will pull the Cougars through any adversity they might face the rest of the way.

"We've been fortunate because the bounces have gone our way," Koons said of his team's current unbeaten streak. "But I'm a big believer that you create your own bounces. The kids have worked hard and gotten what they deserved. We're in a pretty good position league-wise right now, but nothing is locked up at this point and there's still a lot of work left to do."
