# Ike pours it on in third

Eagles get lift from Brothers, Wakefield in division matchup

The much anticipated

Division turned out to be a one-sided affair.

Brock Brothers scored twice and Tyler Wakefield made 20 saves in Eisenhower's 6-1 win over Dakota on Saturday night at Suburban Ice Macomb.

The Eagles led only 2-1 after two but scored four goals in the third period to

break the game open.

"It was closer than the scored showed," said Eisenhower coach Bob Hall, who watched his team move into first place by themselves with a 6-0-1-0 record (13-2-1 overall).

Stefan Trentacosta added a goal and two assists and Aaron Schneider, Shane Czarnik and Marcus Leskiw also scored for the Eagles.

Derek Rutkowski got the lone goal for for Dakota (5-1-1-0 and 14-3-0 overall ).

"In the third we were playing hard but we gave up a goal and a lot of guys stopped skating," said Cougars' coach Mike Jakubik.

Rutkowski put Dakota on the board with 3:30 left in the second period, when his slap shot from the outside of the left circle beat Wakefield high on the short side and it appeared that Dakota had momentum going into the third.

"Giving up that late goal, that was our focus (between periods): Get the momentum back," Hall said.

And when Schneider scored from the hash marks at the inside edge of the right circle halfway through the third, it was clear the Eagles had taken back the momentum.

Brothers got his second goal, on a shorthanded breakaway, 47 seconds later, Czarnik also capitalized on a breakaway opportunity with

4:47 left and Leskiw completed the scoring by putting in a shot off a goal-mouth scramble with less than two minutes left.

Eisenhower led 2-0 after a penalty-filled first period.

Brothers opened the scoring with 5:54 left in the first period when he put one into an empty net off a goal-mouth scramble.

Trentacosta's 4-on-3 power-play goal with 25 seconds left in the period made it 2-0, as he put in a shot from the slot.
