## Maloney nets third-period winner for Ike

Much goes into being captain of an ice hockey team. The captain often is counted on to make a big hit, win a critical faceoff or score a crucial goal. Eisenhower senior Ryan Maloney found himself responsible for the latter, netting the game-winner in a 4-3 win over Stevenson in the first round of the Utica Community Schools Challenge Cup on Friday night.

All of the responsibilities are not lost on Maloney, who relies on a quiet confidence to lead the team.

“Everyone’s watching you,” he explained. “You’ve got to lead everything we do as a team.”

Eisenhower improved to 4-0 in the Macomb Area Conference White division and 9-3 overall. Stevenson, meanwhile, is now 4-1 in the division and 11-4 on the year overall. The Eagles will face

Utica on Sunday at 7 p.m. for the Challenge Cup title at Suburban Macomb. Stevenson and Ford play in the consolation game at 4:45.

The winning goal came just 53 seconds into the third period. Eisenhower dumped the puck in deep — and Maloney did the rest.

“It was basically a wrap-around,” he said. “I came out with the puck and the goalie thought I was going the other way.”

The final three minutes of the game were intense. Stevenson went on the power play with 3:13 to go. Ike sophomore goalie Erik Rodak had to make several key saves, including a point-blank attempt by senior forward Taylor Weiss. Eisenhower got an outstanding defensive effort from Mike Walter and Matt Rodgers on the penalty kill. Senior defenseman Ryan Chovich also was consistently solid.

In the end, it was no surprise to Ike coach Bob Hall that his captain should net the winner.

“Ryan is a fantastic kid,” Hall said. “He’s a role model and a

leader both on and off the ice. He had a big game when we needed him to.”

Stevenson stormed out to a 2-0 lead in the first period, and it seemed as though they would be controlling the game after a pair of power-play markers, one from senior forward Mitch Brinker and another from Justin Zyvon on an absolute bullet from the point. Though out-shot, 14-10, by Ike, the Titans were able to find the back of the net.

The abruptly positive start eventually turned into a negative for the Titans.

“We got off to a real quick lead and quite frankly, I think that

surprised both teams,” Stevenson coach Al Korolewicz said. “Every team, no matter who you are, how talented you are or how hard you work, you tend to sit back when you have a big lead. The bottom line is that they wanted it a little more than us tonight.”

The second period resembled the game itself, in that it was an all-out battle. The Eagles fired an astounding 22 shots on goal, compared to eight for Stevenson.

Zyvon scored again, giving his team a 3-0 lead just 10 seconds into the period. While it would have been easy to write them off at that time, the Eagles

# Stone sets pace for the Cougars

Junior scores 9 points in opening quarter and Dakota sprints to win

Will Stone scored nine points in the opening quarter and helped his Dakota Cougars take a 17-8 lead that paved the way to the defeat of their visiting Macomb Area Conference Red Division rivals, the L’Anse Creuse Lancers, Friday night. Dakota won the contest 60-35 and improved to 2-2 and 4-5 overall.

“Like Jimmy Benefield, my old buddy from Lincoln, said, ‘Some nights you’re the bug, some nights you’re the windshield,’ and we were real lucky tonight we were the windshield,” Dakota coach Bill Snyder said.

The Cougars stretched the 17-8 margin to 32-16 in the second quarter. They outscored L’Anse Creuse in all four quarters.

And, the offensive inequality was especially evident at the free-throw line, where Dakota was 7-for-9 and the Lancers were 2-for-10.

Despite a 16-point deficit, senior Herman Washington scored seven points to spark the Lancers’ second-half offense.

The Lancers fell to 0-3 in the MAC Red division.

“They didn’t shoot the ball as well as they would have liked and we had things going for us,” Snyder said of the 25-point margin of victory.

“Every once in a while it happens that way. It’s really no indication of either team. It’s just one of those nights.”

Stone, a junior, led the Cougars with 15 points. Three of his teammates, Mark Morris, Alec Tortamasi, and Evan Walker, scored nine apiece.

“One of the things we really wanted to focus on tonight was trying to get a little penetration and get back to the rim, and really stretching out their defense,” Snyder said. “Will did a great job of getting to the basket for us and he does that very well.”
